OPEN CALL FOR VISUAL ARTISTS BASED IN SOUTH BRAZIL FOR A THREE-MONTH RESIDENCY



GUIDANCE NOTES

For the fourth year, Instituto Inclusartiz and Delfina Foundation are offering a three-month residency in London to a Brazilian visual artist. The residency will take place during Delfina Foundation's winter 2023 season (5 January -30 March).

As part of Instituto Inclusartiz's aim to contribute towards the international exposure and presence of Brazilian artists and curators, the annual residency open calls circulate around the different regions of Brazil. In 2023 the focus will be artists living and working in South Brazil (*Região Sul do Brasil*).

ABOUT THE RESIDENCY HOST

Delfina Foundation is dedicated to facilitating artistic exchange and developing creative practice through residencies, partnerships and public programming. Its residencies support artists, curators and thinkers to collectively explore specific themes or to independently engage in open research.

Each year, Delfina Foundation runs four residency seasons. These residency periods are dedicated 'open' independent research or '<u>thematic</u>' collective research around a specific issue or idea. This residency will take place during the 'open' winter 2023 season.

Alongside gaining time and space to develop their work, Delfina Foundation's residents participate in a bespoke programme that includes:

- Guided visits to museums, galleries, non-profits, artistrun spaces and studios, as well as trips to institutions outside London.
- Opportunities to meet and engage with artists, curators, academics and researchers through organised presentations, studio visits, events and meals.
- Professional development activities including presentations and crits, portfolio reviews, and mentoring activities.
- Collaborative exchange between residents through informal gatherings, crits and meals.

THE SELECTED APPLICANT WILL RECEIVE:

A twelve-week residency at Delfina Foundation, including:

- A return economy-class flight
- Airport transfers in the UK
- Reimbursement of visa fee (if required)
- A living allowance of £30 per day
- A materials budget of £700
- A local travel pass for London Underground and buses
- A single bedroom with a desk at Delfina Foundation a house which hosts up to 8 residents with shared facilities, including: bathrooms, laundry rooms, a kitchen, library and dining room.

REQUIREMENTS

- Applicants must be a Brazilian citizen currently living and working in the South Region of Brazil (inc. Paraná, Rio Grande do Sul, and Santa Catarina);
- Seeking an opportunity to develop their practice through research;
- Able to explain how the experience of an international residency may benefit their career development and local networks; and
- An intermediate level of English.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

> Can duos or collectives apply?

Generally, it is difficult for us to host residencies with collectives, given the resources and space required to host them. Our accommodation comprises of eight single rooms. We recommend that collectives or duos who wish to apply put forth one member to represent them in-residence if they are prepared to work in such a way.

> Can the partners, children, dependents or pets of international residents be accommodated? Delfina Foundation is a communal residence with limited space. Over the years we have discovered that the nature of our accommodation, as well as our intensive programmes, does not usually suit non-participants or pets/ESAs being resident on-site. If it is essential that a selected international programme participant be accompanied for part or all of the residency they will need to organise their own accommodation during this time. > How can specific access support be attained? Delfina Foundation has always welcomed applicants from all backgrounds, including D/deaf, disabled and neurodivergent artists and others who have specific needs. We are open to discussing how our residencies can be adapted to meet the needs of selected residents.
